Class of 2016: Back into the Harvest Field



Students from 15 nations, from Senegal to Madagascar, received their diplomas on November 12 in the WAAST International Chapel. These 107 "Pentecostal Workers for the Great Harvest Here and Beyond" have returned to their respective parts of the field to work and to train other workers. Sixteen earned the Post-secondary Diploma in Theology, 75 the Bachelor of Theology degree, and 16 the Master of Arts in Missiology. Class speakers Achille Raharimalala (Madagascar, French section) and Bermose Zonou (Cameroon, English section) spoke on the scope of the harvest and our responsibility, based on the class verses (Jn 4:35; 1Co 10:15-16). Dr. Daplex Honoré, chair of the WAAST Board of Governors, preached from Luke

WAAST Receives APTEA Accreditation

During the graduation ceremony, Murriell Accreditation McCullev. chair of the Commission of the Association of Pentecostal Theological Education in Africa, presented to WAAST its Certificate of Accreditation.
