On November 11, 115 Harvest workers from 14 nations were awarded their diplomas: 19 the Postsecondary Diploma, 73 the Bachelor of Theology degree, and 23 the Master of Arts in Missiology. WAAST Vice President Rev. Jean Bandé: A Celebration of Ministry



Rev. Jean Bandé was honored with a retirement celebration in the WAAST International Chapel on Sunday, November 12, for his 29 years of ministry to the school and the Chapel. When Pastor Bandé came with his family in 1988, he had already spent 22 years in ministry in Burkina Faso and Côte d'Ivoire. He instilled in students his passion for planting churches and mobilizing people for missions as a WAAST professor and as academic dean and then vice president of the school. He worked with the WAAST International Chapel from its beginning in 1989 and became the senior pastor in 1998. His wife, Clarisse, also

1967-2017: 50 Years of Education in Africa!

In October 1967, a young educator landed in Dakar, Senegal. Mary Ballenger served her first missionary term as a teacher and director of Dakar Academy, a school for missionary children. But her passion is training African pastors and leaders, and for the next 20 years she directed the Bible Institute of Senegal. She arrived at WAAST in 1995 and served as registrar, then as academic dean. In the midst of her teaching and administrative duties, she completed her doctoral studies in missions in 2005. Dr. Ballenger was named president of WAAST in 2010 and continues to serve in this position.
