### Welcome, New and Returning Students!



The new semester began on Monday, February 26, with a record enrollment of 108 BTh and Diploma students. Of these, 29 are first-year students. Students have come from 11 nations, stretching from Guinea to Congo-Brazzaville. Togo boasts the highest number enrolled (68). Courses over this 9-week semester will be taught

#### Welcome, New Campus Team Members!

We are happy to have two new smiling faces on WAAST's Lomé campus, as Dr. Jimmie and Cynthia Lemons have joined the resident staff.

The Lemonses arrived in Cameroon in 1992 and served with Full Gospel Mission in the areas of evangelism, youth, church planting, and training. Seeing the need for advanced theological training, they launched the WAAST extension center in Mbalmayo in 1997. To date, 155 Cameroonians and



several from other nations have passed through this center. Today some 75% of the leaders of the FGM and of the AG-Cameroon are WAAST alumni. In 2015 the Lemonses handed over leadership of the center to alumnus Dr. Felix Niba.

Dr. Lemons will serve both with WAAST as a professor and with Pan-Africa Theological Seminary as the Francophone Coordinator of its doctoral program. The Lemonses have one son, Michael, a second-year university student.

#### **MA Program to Offer New Study Tracks**

Beginning with the May 2018 session, WAAST's graduate program, Assemblies of God Graduate School of Theology, will offer the degree of Master of Arts in Theological Studies. Three specialized tracks are available: Cross-cultural Ministries (formerly called Missiology), Christian Education, and Counseling. Each program requires seven common core courses, courses in the area of specialization, a practicum, and a thesis. Students who have already progressed well into the MA in Missiology program may still opt to follow a new track, with the understanding that they may apply their completed core courses, then must complete all the new requirements for the chosen track.

**SIERRA LEONE:** To accommodate bi-vocational pastors, the WAAST center here has introduced evening classes, with 16 students participating. Another 10 students follow courses during the day. We thank God for the growth of the center in this nation, where secret societies, false teachings, and Islam greatly challenge the Church. Many WAAST alumni are involved in lay and pastoral training to help strengthen God's people.
