“Ambassadors of Christ for the Missio Dei”

On November 9, 119 “Ambassadors of Christ for the *Missio Dei*” were awarded their diplomas: 10 the Post-secondary Diploma in Theology, 98 the Bachelor of Theology, and 11 the Master of Arts in Missiology. These new alumni, from 13 nations in West and Central Africa, have been sent out to continue their ministries, better equipped to lead at national- to local-church levels, train others in Bible schools, and plant more churches in their own nations and in others. Among the five candidates who received the PhD degree from Pan-Africa Theological Seminary (PATHS) were three WAAST alumni: Cephas Adenehu (Ghana), Jimmy Kuoh (Liberia), and Arthur Mba (Gabon).



WAAST and PATHS were honored to have as graduation speaker Dr. Barnabas Mtokambali, general superintendent of the Assemblies of God of Tanzania, president of the Africa Assemblies of God Alliance, and chairman of PATHS’ Board of Directors. The ceremony also provided an occasion to formally recognize and pray for three recently inducted leaders of these schools: Rev. Mark Turney as WAAST president, Dr. John Easter as PATHS chancellor, and Dr. Steve Pennington as vice chancellor.

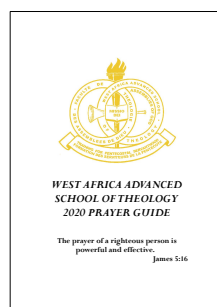
