MA Session Sees Highest Enrollment to Date

This same headline appeared in 2019, when 88 students enrolled in the Master's session. The session was canceled in 2020, but this year 92 students from 15 nations are enrolled—this despite economic and travel difficulties. Professors from 10 nations in Africa and North America are teaching, two of whom have interacted with their students in the classroom via Zoom teleconferencing. Steve and Trina Pennington have served in Africa for nearly 30 years. They raised three children in East Africa: Josiah, Priscilla, and Micah. They have served among the Somali; in administrative and teaching roles in AG Bible colleges in Ethiopia and Kenya; in ministry to women and children; and in various leadership roles, including Area Director for AGWM-USA missionaries in the East Africa/Indian Ocean nations. Both hold advanced degrees from AGTS: Steve a PhD in Intercultural Studies, and Trina an MA in Leadership and Ministry. Steve currently serves as Vice Chancellor for PAThS. Trina is the AGWM Missionary



Representative to the AAGA Women's Ministries Department. They have joined the team at WAAST to better fulfill these roles.

WAAST Marks 50 Years

WAAST opened in 1971, offering an Associate Degree in Theology and graduating its first 11 students in 1974. Today WAAST offers both undergraduate and Master's degrees in theology and counts 1,830 alumni. A 50-year anniversary celebration will be held at a later date, due to current restrictions, and will be announced when the date is determined.
