### Today's Prayer Requests and Praise Reports : *From Students, Alumni, and Workers*

**GUINEA: Praise report:** Recently we prayed that the Lord would providing housing for two pastors in a predominately Muslim area of the country. The worker reports: "We have had divine help, and I found two houses and each pastor has moved in with his family." At that same time, another pastor was kicked out of his lodging, but God intervened and they have found an even better house.

**Prayer request:** "Pray that the area of Fouta-Djallon, stronghold of the Fulani, will be taken into consideration as a missionary burden in Guinea. All missions are in Conakry, the capital, and in Forested Guinea [southeast]. Christ must be preached everywhere, despite the challenges and difficulties." Staunchly Muslim Fulani cattle herders have dominated the Fouta-Djallon area, the mountainous region in west-central Guinea, since the 15<sup>th</sup> century. Praise God for the ten churches that have been planted, but more workers are needed to reach the two million-plus inhabitants.

**SENSITIVE COUNTRY:** A worker in a Muslim-majority nation shares several requests. Please pray

- that God would send a trained, Pentecostal pastor from sub-Saharan Africa to help lead a church that is 90% African;
- for a divine move of the Holy Spirit on this and other congregations, that many would be filled, speak in other tongues, and be empowered for witness;
- that the Spirit would guide efforts and open doors to plant a church in another city;
- that Muslim neighbors, as they have contact with these expatriate believers or seek help from churches, would be drawn to learn more about the God they serve;
- for the provision of more appropriate housing for this worker and his family.

### *World Watch List 2021: Tunisia (26/50)\**

The gospel came to North Africa and present-day Tunisia early in church history, but dissensions weakened the once-strong church and people readily accepted the religion of the invading Arabs in the 600s. Today, 99% of Tunisia's 11.8 million people follow Islam, the state religion. Many are nominal Muslims. and the society is quite secular. Some mix witchcraft in their Islamic practices. Since 2011, Islam is becoming more entrenched in the government, and those who turn to Jesus face strong opposition from family, employers, and authorities. The few hundred evangelical believers are scattered and find it difficult to meet, and sharing their faith with Muslims is forbidden. Please pray

- that Jesus would reveal himself supernaturally to seekers, and that entire families would come to Him;
- that many seekers would be reached through online resources and TV and radio programs in their heart languages (mainly Tunisian Arabic);
- that the Spirit would encourage and strengthen the few believers, and that a network of house churches may be established where new believers can be assimilated and disciplined.
